- When cooking, remain in the kitchen and keep a fire extinguisher close by
- Make sure holiday decorations are in good condition and are used as designed
- Develop and practice a home fire escape plan with your family

## COOKING SAFETY

- Always plug electrical appliances directly into an outlet, not an extension cord or power strip.
- While cooking, stay in the kitchen and remember to check on your food often.
- If a non-grease fire develops, immediately cover the pot or pan to smother the fire, turn off the appliance and call 911.
- If a fire starts in the oven, shut the oven to contain the fire, turn it off and call 911.
- Always keep a [fire extinguisher](#) nearby. Never use water to extinguish a grease fire.
- Keep pets and children away from cooking surfaces and nearby countertops.

## DECORATION SAFETY

- Make sure that string lights and other holiday decorations are in good condition. Do not use decorations with broken or frayed electrical cords.
- When decorating outdoors, only use decorations, extension cords and outlets that are designated for outdoor use.
- Never run cords under carpeting, bedding or other flammable materials.

- Check that cords aren't pinched or pressed, such as under a couch or between furniture and the wall.
- Never overload your outlets or use extension cords as a replacement for outlets.

- Keep fire safety top of mind, every day.
